Match Report: A kindly break in the week's weather ensured that the fixture went ahead. We were keen to redeem ourselves following last year's failed run chase.

The match managers had agreed a ten a side match and the IZ elected to bat (as usual). Despite Charlie Phillips unavailability, we knew that our revised opening attack of Parker and Bligh was going to cause some unease for the IZ batsman. This, coupled with the menacing right arm medium of Messrs Lerwill and Bostock meant that IZ were 57-4 and then 93-6. Duff contributed admirably with a good wicket during a tight spell of left arm spin. We fielded (and bowled) with great aplomb and commitment ALL morning, but the IZ managed to reach 212, before the final wicket fell.

Time was on our side, but IZ may have felt that they had the upper hand when we were reduced to 57 for 3, but a fantastic 81 run partnership by the Chairman and Cross saw us well on our way to victory. However, we contrived to lose four wickets, which left us needing 26 with only two wickets in hand. Like the IZ's batting order, the Stragglers' line up was deceptive. Parker, despite starting tentatively (8 from 22 balls) began flexing his muscles with four fours and a large six to give us a comfortable two wicket victory with 20 balls remaining.

While we left the park victorious, wandering cricket was the clear winner of the day. Both sides played with great fair play and bon homie and the grub was its usual very high standard.
